After the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) came into existence, it was realized that there is an acute shortage of human resources for reha-bilitating a very large population of disabled in the country. During the year 1995, RCI through setting up of an expert committee, made an esti-mate that by the end of the 10th Plan the country may need about 7,24,000 trained personnel to deal with disability (although this not proved). (Project report on HRD for disabilities 2009)

Keeping this as a background, RCI has started M.Phil in Rehabilitation Psychology in 2003 in National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped (NIMH), Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh. Since then Sweekar-Upkaar and Amity University have started this course. It has been a decade and number of Professionals have passed out. It would be great idea to come under one roof and strive for professional acumen and bring out best clinician out of us to serve persons with disabili-ties and their families and easing the economic burden of the country.
